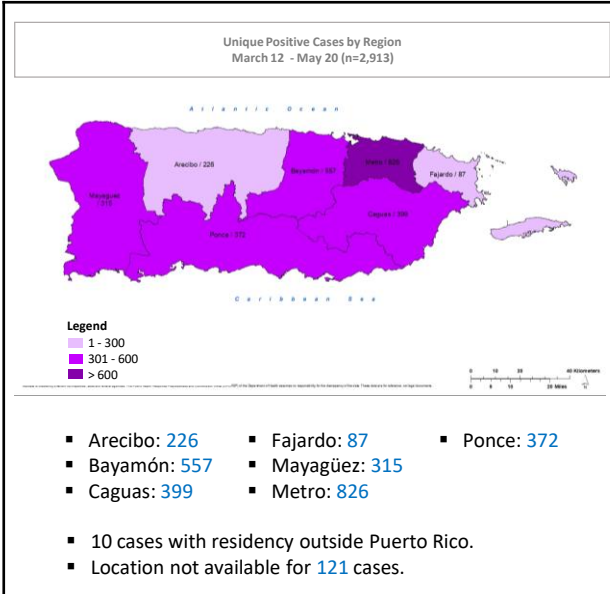


Current Situation:

Puerto Rico Government is responding to an outbreak of a respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other locations internationally. The WHO declared a COVID-19 pandemic on March 11, 2020. The first case of COVID-19 in Puerto Rico was notified on March 13, 2020. Puerto Rico Governor declared a state of emergency and activated the National Guard. On May 1, 2020 the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-038 stating an extension to the lockdown and curfew until May 25, 2020. The curfew decreed by the Governor stays from 1900 to 0500. Some outdoor physical activities are allowed from 0500 to 1400. The closure of some sectors was extended until May 25, 2020. Some exceptions are related to: Health and dental services, food chain, gas stations and providers, financial institutions, organizations or groups that provide services to vulnerable persons, auto repair and part shops, hardware stores, textile businesses with labors correlated to the emergency, laundries and laundromats, official vehicle inspection centers, among others.

This report includes data based on the information provided by hospitals in Puerto Rico. The data does not include rehabilitation, correctional and psychiatric hospitals; VA Caribbean Healthcare System; and, Vieques and Culebra municipalities' health centers. The numbers related to COVID-19 occupied and/or in use ICU beds and ventilators are already included in the total occupied (these are not additional numbers). The information regarding census and availability is based on active beds at each hospital. These beds are reported by hospitals based on the available equipment and personnel to manage these operations. These numbers can change daily based on the hospital decisions and available resources.
